As always Christmas is an exciting and busy time in school We have planned several events to celebrate the festivities and I hope this newsletter will keep you informed.


### Health Promoting Schools Re-accreditation Visit

On Wednesday 23rd November Mr Garnett and Mrs Chacko visited our school to assess our practices in Health and Wellbeing. Mrs Boath, Mrs Sherriff and the health committee worked extremely hard to prepare the visit and presented a very informative presentation on health and wellbeing at Newtyle School as well as taking Mr Garnett and Mrs Chacko on a very thorough tour of our school, including the toilets!!

Our visitors also spoke to our P7 pupils about the range of extra responsibilities they have been carrying out and to our pupil council to find out how they support and improve our school. The visit went extremely well and I am delighted to say that we have been re-accredited as a Health Promoting School. The follow up report indicated a number of strengths including the 'excellent range of health promoting activities across the school.
